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HF in Finland

- HF understood widely in Finland
 - 2 programs on long-term homelessness
 - 1 program on prevention
 - Currently being developed: HF 2.0
- HF training organised mainly by:
 - Housing First Development Network
 - Housing Advice Forum



Starting points

- Adopting Housing First requires new professional orientation & a mind-shift
- Equal professionalism
 - -> Dialogue starts from the need of a client
- Individually tailored services according to each person's needs
- Support work is done in a person's home
- Leadership! Permission to do things in a new way
- -> Also staff needs support and opportunities to learn from each other!



New skills are needed

- Law on renting and tenant rights
 - <- a new thing for social and health workers
- Working in multiprofessional teams
- New training needs arise when tenants settle in; how to deal with trauma, how to develop meaningful activities




Project Networking for Development 2013-2019 2020 -> Housing First Development Network

- To clarify the meaning of Housing First principle and to mainstream it in homeless services in cooperation with NGOs and cities and

Training spearheads

- Most participants work in HF and the needs arise from their work. Training cannot be contradictory to HF principles.
- Popular topics run non-stop (e.g. legal issues)
- Training is topical, reflects the needs from the field.
- Constant evaluation after each training session and gathering of ideas and needs. Topics based on the feedback & need



- Always enough time for sharing
- Open to everyone, free of charge, Skype participation available
- Expertise from the networks (many levels: researchers, people with lived experience, frontline workers etc.), sometimes external trainers,
- Utilising Train the trainer Finnish Edition
